Subject: National Express Term Plus season ticket: exclusive offer

We have recently been working with National Express West Midlands (NXWM) to develop a bus pass which is valid both on The Green Bus services and on the NXWM bus network. Such a pass has been requested by our customers and partner schools for many years.

We are pleased to say that we will shortly be offering an NXWM Term Plus pass to our annual season ticket customers for a special "add-on" price of £95 for the remainder of the 2017/18 academic year.

The Term Plus pass will be added to your existing smartcard. Once upgraded, the pass will be valid on NXWM services until 31 July 2018: it includes travel at any time, including evenings, weekends, and school holidays.

We hope that the Term Plus pass will be very useful to pupils who stay late for activities in school, or who have differing journey requirements during the week, or who use NXWM buses at weekends and during school holidays. The Term Plus pass will also be valid on NXWM buses if you happen to miss The Green Bus to or from school.

We will be sending an email to all our annual season ticket holders later this week which gives full details of the offer, including how to purchase the Term Plus top-up pass.
