The past month

In glimpses it has started to feel like summer after a long winter! The first few games of cricket have been played and it is good to see a full fixture list. Easter saw students visit the USA with the Geography department and RAF cadets on camps in the UK and in Europe. I am grateful to the staff who took these visits and look forward to hearing more in forthcoming assemblies.

The 'Change your Mind' mental health team (under the guidance of Mrs McPhee) were highly commended in the Mayor's annual awards. The team have now worked with 14 different primary schools! Finally, Mrs Mehta has brought to my attention the valiant work carried out by the Blood Cancer charity DKMS. Please see her message at the bottom of this email.

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We are teaming up with DKMS in a bid to raise awareness of blood cancer, blood stem cell donation and to register potentially lifesaving blood stem cell donors. DMKS is an international based charity organization helping to delete blood cancer.

We will be holding an event to register as many donors as possible at QMGS on Wednesday 2^{nd} May, from 4pm – 6:30pm.

- Every 20 minutes someone in the UK is diagnosed with a blood cancer such as Leukemia, Lymphoma or Myeloma
- This cancer can be treated if a matching donor is found
- The window in which to find a donor can be very short
- Only 30% of patients find a compatible bone marrow donor within their family
- The likelihood of finding a life-saving match would be 1 in 3 for white patients but is just 1 in 125,000 for those of Asian or Afro-Caribbean descent

The initiative gives everyone the opportunity to make a genuine difference to the lives of those affected by blood cancer.

At present there is a big drive to find a donor for a young 11 year old boy who was diagnosed with Leukemia and for whom the traditional treatments are not working. You can look up the story on line by typing in match4Rajie.

People aged between 17 and 55 can come and register to be a potential lifesaver. You can register as a potential blood stem cell donor either online (<u>https://www.dkms.org.uk/en/register-now</u>) and complete your swabs at home, or register at a donor recruitment drive which is taking place on Wednesday 2nd May between 4-6:30pm at the schools main reception. It takes just 10 minutes.
